JAIROS JIRI ASSOCIATION DONATION OF WHEELCHAIRS AND SCHOOL FEES



Stanbic Bank has been supporting the Jairos Jiri Association since 2006 through various activities. The association is probably the largest of its kind in Africa. It serves over 3500 men, women, boys and girls with disabilities in their communities annually through the Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) programme. The Association also runs 16 centres where 1200 children and adults get treatment, rehabilitation, education, training, empowerment and care. This past quarter Stanbic Bank donated 5 wheelchairs to its Harare Children's Centre and paid school fees for 10 of the most needy primary school children with disabilities in Rusape and Bulawayo.

HOMEFIELD DONATION OF TELEVISION SETS



Homefield Centre was established in 1964 for the care and education of intellectually handicapped individuals aged from 18 years and above. It is under the umbrella name of Zimcare Trust and is managed by the Centre Management Committee made up of parents and volunteers. The Centre which is located in Mount Hampden presently has 90 residents. Stanbic Bank donated 2 Television Sets to the Home.

ZIMBABWE ALBINO ASSOCIATION (ZIMAS) SCHOOL FEES ASSISTANCE



Zimbabwe Albino Association was formed in 1996. Its main objective is to assist albinos throughout Zimbabwe to live better lives. Albinos throughout Africa experience several social and physiological problems such as skin cancer, poor eyesight, low educational qualifications, ostracism by society, and serious levels of unemployment. Zimas has more than 13 000 registered albinos to date. Stanbic Bank donated towards school fees payments for albino children from disadvantaged backgrounds.
